Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)

Mission: to promote policies to improve the economic and social well-being of people around the world.

The OECD provides a forum in which governments work together to share experiences and seek solutions to common problems. Its work is based on continued monitoring of events in member countries as well as outside OECD area.

The OECD Secretariat collects and analyses data,
then committees discuss policy,
the Council makes decisions,
and then governments implement recommendations.

OECD Development Assistance Committee (DAC)

Unique forum where donor governments (and multilateral organisations like the World Bank and the United Nations) come together to increase the effectiveness of their aid and coordinate their development efforts.

The DAC uses its statistics to monitor member country's performances against established targets (e.g. 0.7% ODA/GNI ratio).

Mandate:

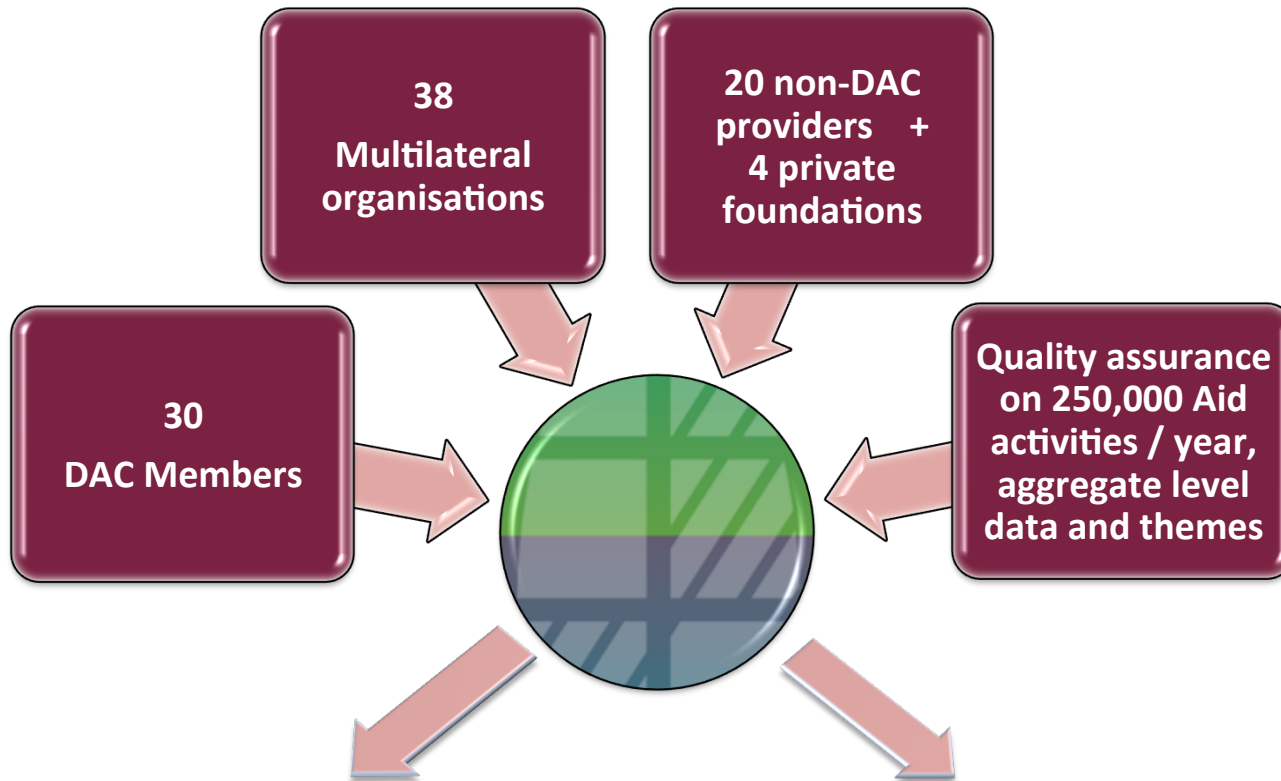
“ ... promote development co-operation and other policies so as to contribute to sustainable development, including pro-poor economic growth, poverty reduction, improvement of living standards in developing countries, and a future in which no country will depend on aid.”

Official Development Assistance (ODA) - Definition

Resource flows to countries and territories on the DAC List of ODA Recipients and to multilateral development institutions that are:

- i. Provided by official agencies, including state and local governments, or by their executive agencies; and
- ii. Concessional (i.e. grants and soft loans) and administered with the promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries as the main objective.

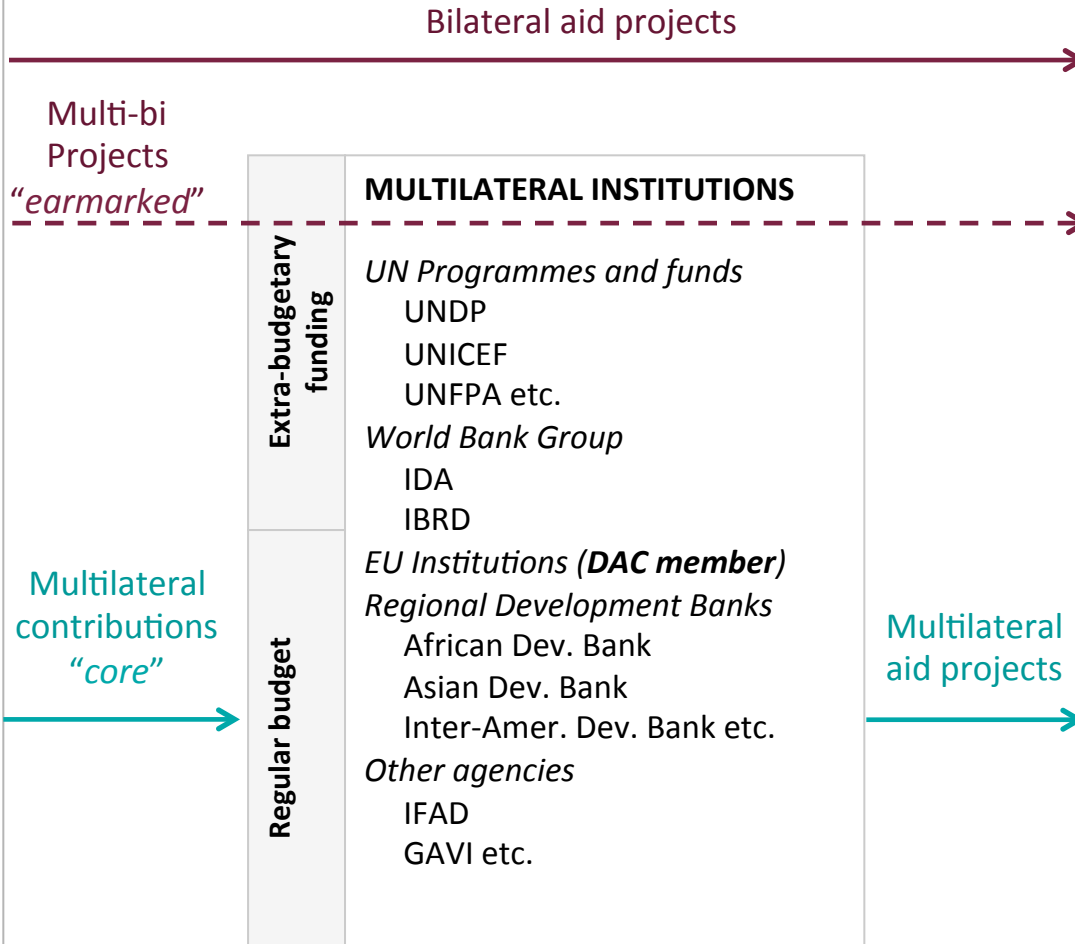

ESA's program "Space in support of International Development Aid"

- ESA consulted and sought guidance from OECD when designing this program to meet conditions for ODA-eligibility.
- DAC Secretariat made recommendation to its members to count contributions to this program as ODA (earmarked, bilateral).
- ✓ **WP-STAT June meeting approved it as ODA-eligible.**
 - Assigned unique channel of delivery code (easy identif. in database) and listed in "Single table" on DAC website.
 - Email to WP-STAT members and meeting summary record recapitulated decisions.
 - Contrib. will count towards 0.7 ODA/GNI target.

How does “Space4IDA” fit into the ODA picture?

Aims to support economic development of ODA-eligible countries by mainstreaming use of satellite-derived environmental information for international development aid projects, in partnership with key stakeholders (IFIs, EU national aid agencies, developing countries). Will lead to:

- Wider-scale use of satellite capabilities (in particular EO-based environmental information) in field of development aid.
- Increased efficiencies in existing projects, improved policy definition and planning of future activities and better transparency, responsibility and accountability through use of open data.
- Sustainable transfer of technical skills and know-how for producing and using this satellite information into developing countries (long-term goal).

Contributions that members make to this program will count as ODA (“multi-bi”, earmarked) and contribute to ODA targets.
